## KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**Expansion of support and impact:** ACC&D expanded both our [Board of Directors and Scientific Advisory Council](#), adding leaders and increasing the expertise guiding our organization. We grew our [Organizational Partners Program](#) to 131 groups from 19 countries and 20 U.S. states.

We celebrated the formation of our [Council of Stakeholders](#)—a group of leading organizations providing strategic and networking support as well as core financial support to help ensure ACC&D's sustainability. Council members in 2011 included [The Adam & Amber Tarshis Foundation](#), [ASPCA®](#), [Best Friends Animal Society](#), [HSUS](#), [Parsemus Foundation](#), [Petco Foundation](#), [PetSmart Charities®](#), and [The Regina Bauer Frankenberg Foundation](#).

**Esterisol™/Zeuterin use and learning:** ACC&D provided financial and strategic support for a [study](#) being conducted in Chile comparing the behavior of intact dogs with both castrated dogs and those neutered with Esterisol, the non-surgical sterilant for male dogs. ACC&D also [supported three other organizations](#) using Esterisol internationally in small field projects. In preparation for the 2012 launch of this same formulation in the United States—where it will be called Zeuterin®—ACC&D provided scientifically sound, animal welfare-oriented [educational materials](#), presentations, and advice to the animal welfare and veterinary community.

**Scientific Think Tank:** ACC&D convened [16 experts](#) to investigate how computer modeling and field studies adapted from wildlife biology could be applied to cat and dog population management design. A [report](#) was developed from the meeting. The project plan developed by the participants focuses first on creating a model for free-roaming cat populations in which different surgical (and later non-surgical) interventions can be assessed for impact on population. In December, ACC&D was awarded a [generous grant by the ASPCA®](#) to fund the development of this initial model. Future work includes development of a model for free-roaming dog populations.

### **Multi-Year Cat Contraceptive:**

While work toward permanent sterilants for cats continues, a multi-year contraceptive for feral cat populations (which often lack access to spay/neuter) could have great impact. ACC&D explored the research and development pathway for two different current approaches with potential as multi-year contraceptives for cats. A special committee identified the gateway studies needed to determine viability for the formulation judged most promising. At year-end, ACC&D advised on an application for funding of an initial study. ACC&D also explored different business models for advancing commercialization of such a product.

*The mission of ACC&D is to expedite the successful introduction of methods to non-surgically sterilize dogs and cats and to support the distribution and promotion of these products to humanely control cat and dog populations worldwide.*




## FINANCIAL INFORMATION


